Insurance and Liability cover

It is important to remember that unless you are a qualified instructor you may be liable for your actions when on the hills, canoeing, mountain biking, climbing etc. This is even truer when dealing with children. You should not be leading a group if you are not suitably qualified.

Several Insurance Companies offer medical/accident cover etc, if you run into trouble particularly when you are abroad and you might be considered foolhardy if you didn't consider the right level of cover. One of our ski group ending up with an insurance bill of £2500 last year, the £90 premium on the insurance policy was money well spent. There is now a new E111 for sickness cover abroad, pick up a leaflet at the Post office if you don't have a plastic card issued during the last 9 months.
